About The Felix Project

The Felix Project is a London-based UK charity set up in 2016 by Justin and Jane Byam Shaw, to commemorate the kindness and compassion of their Son, Felix, following his sudden death.

Every year, tonnes of perfectly good food are wasted, the environmental impact of which is huge. At the same time, millions of people in London regularly experience hunger. Inspired by Felix, we set out to change this. We are working towards **a London where no good food is wasted, and no-one goes hungry**. We rescue food that cannot be sold and would otherwise go to waste. This food is perfectly good for human consumption and includes a high proportion of fresh fruit and vegetables as well as baked goods, salads, meat and fish. We collect or receive deliveries from a variety of food suppliers from farms to supermarkets, wholesalers to restaurants.

We check, sort and then deliver this food to community organisations all over London that cook meals and prepare food parcels for people in their communities – organisations such as community centres, churches, primary schools, holiday clubs, hostels and holiday programmes.

OUR VISION

A London where good food is never wasted, and no-one goes hungry.

OUR MISSION

To get good quality, nutritious food to people in need by making use of the surplus food in the UK's food supply, saving it from becoming waste and harming the planet.

THE FELIX PROJECT'S IMPACT

Since March 2016 we have redistributed the equivalent of over 100 million meals across London. This represents not only a huge environmental impact (when food is wasted, all the resources that were used in the production, transport, packaging etc are also wasted) but also a huge impact on the ability of community organisations across London to support people in their neighbourhoods.

In 2022 The Felix Project developed its first Theory of Change and we have started to understand our work through an impact lens to ensure that the work we do results in the biggest impact possible and that we understand the efficacy of our activities.

COMMUNITY PARTNERSHIPS

We deliver food to almost 1,000 organisations dedicated to supporting their local communities by feeding and helping people who are struggling, who live in poverty or who need help for a variety of reasons – for example due to homelessness, social isolation, mental-health issues, abuse, addiction, physical disability and illness.

Many of these incredible organisations cook food from scratch using the fresh, healthy ingredients they receive from The Felix Project. They offer people the chance to enjoy a nutritious hot meal in a friendly and supportive environment. And the savings they make from receiving Felix food means their own funding goes further, which can sometimes keep charities from closing or cutting services.

Almost 200 of the 1,000 community organisations we worked with last year are schools, some of which teach children from London's most deprived neighbourhoods. At the end of the school day, a Felix 'market stall' is set up in the playground. Pupils and their families are invited to take a selection of Felix food home that would otherwise have gone to waste.

OUR SUPPLIERS

The Felix Project works with the UK's food industry to rescue food from becoming waste. The food that we rescue includes a high proportion of fruit and vegetables. However due to our high number of valued relationships, we are able to deliver a broad range of produce to suit the needs of our hundreds of community organisations.

Our supply partners include supermarkets, manufacturers, wholesalers, farms and growers, restaurants, delicatessens and lunch-time 'grab and go' chains. Additionally, since 2021, we have been proud partners of the FareShare network who deliver surplus produce to each of our warehouses daily.

We take pride in the relationships we have with our supply partners and have many partnerships that support us in different ways. For example, financial donations, staff volunteering their time to come help in our depots or Kitchen, or putting on fundraisers. We are immensely thankful and incredibly grateful for their support and commitment.

OUR OPERATIONS

We have 4 depots around London, in Park Royal (West London), Enfield (North London), Deptford (South-East London) and Poplar (East London). We also run the Green Scheme which uses electric vans and walking and cycling routes to collect and deliver surplus food directly from Supplier to Community partner.

We are immensely proud of Felix's Kitchen, which we built in 2021. Here, a team of creative professional chefs supported by up to 30 volunteers a day, turn surplus food into healthy and delicious meals that can be easily heated. Our Kitchen produces between 3,000 and 5,000 meals per day. These meals are an ideal complement to the food we can offer our community organisations, who are supporting people who do not have the resources to cook for themselves, or who cannot afford to prepare food due to high energy prices.

OUR FELIX FAMILY

In addition to our staff team, we are incredibly grateful to the 8,600 volunteers that donated their time to The Felix Project in 2022, without the support of whom we simply would not have been able to achieve what we did. Volunteers are an absolute essential ingredient in our Felix Family recipe! Whether coming in on a weekly basis to drive a van or help in the depot or Kitchen, coming in for a teambuilding day with colleagues, or supporting on a standalone project, we value their time and input more than words can convey.

THE FUTURE

During 2023 The Felix Project continued to respond to the rising external pressures of environmental issues and societal pressures, both felt by communities in every single borough of London in a cost-of-living crisis. We always strive to do the best we can to the best of our ability, maintaining our positive, entrepreneurial spirit to overcome challenges and improve.

2024 is the last year of our current strategic period so whilst we will be focusing on the strategic objectives that we set out in 2020, we will also be lifting our eyes to the horizon to form our next strategy. 2024 will be a formative time for the next 5 years of The Felix Project and what we want to achieve next, moving us towards our vision of a London where no good food is wasted, and no Londoner goes hungry. We have some impactful partnerships, including with the Mayor of London who is committed to support our vision, and we are delighted to count His Majesty the King amongst our supporters and donors. We have achieved a great deal in our first 7 years, but we have much bigger ambitions for the impact we know we can still have – both environmentally and for the incredible community organisations we support. An example of this was seen this summer, where we partnered with the Mayor to address holiday hunger – delivering over 3.5m meals to families in need during the Summer holidays.

Alongside our colleagues, volunteers, supporters, food and community partners we are seeking new Trustees who want to join us in our bold ambitions for London communities and for our environment. Terms of Appointment
