# About Royal Botanic Gardens, Kew

Royal Botanic Gardens, Kew is a worldfamous scientific organisation, internationally respected for its outstanding collections as well as its scientific expertise in plant and fungal diversity, conservation and sustainable development in the UK and around the world. It has two main sites: Kew Gardens in south-west London, which is also a UNESCO World Heritage Site, and Wakehurst, Kew's wild botanic garden in West Sussex. Combined, Kew Gardens' 132 hectares of landscaped gardens, and Wakehurst's 535-acre site, attracts over 2.5 million visitors every year. The Kew Madagascar Conservation Centre is Kew's only overseas office and third research centre. Kew receives approximately one third of its funding

from Government through the Department for the Environment, Food and Rural Affairs (Defra) and research councils. Further funding needed to support RBG Kew's vital work comes from donors, membership and commercial activity including ticket sales, events, and licencing.

Kew Science's purpose is to help stop biodiversity loss and develop nature-based solutions to some of humanity's biggest global challenges. Kew scientists work with collaborators in over 400 institutions from more than 100 countries to help find solutions to urgent global challenges. # Kew's Manifesto for Change 2021-2030

Kew's ultimate goal is to step up to help end the extinction crisis and contribute to creating a world where nature is protected, valued by all and managed sustainably. In the wake of a global pandemic, and with the future of the planet in peril, the strategy represents a public commitment by Kew to do everything in its power to reverse the environmental devastation of biodiversity loss and climate change. To deliver this mission, Kew's Manifesto for Change 2021-2030 centres around five key priorities for the coming decade. These commitments are based on how Kew believes it can best deploy its expertise and other assets, including Wakehurst, to make a distinctive and substantial contribution to solving these global challenges. Kew also has a sixth internal priority to ensure that it has the people, financial health and infrastructure to deliver its Manifesto priorities.

- 1. Deliver science-based knowledge and solutions to protect biodiversity and use natural resources sustainably.
- 2. Inspire people to protect the natural world.
- 3. Train the next generation of experts.
- 4. Extend our reach.
- 5. Influence national and international opinion and policy.



# About Wakehurst

Wakehurst, formerly known as Wakehurst Place, is a house and botanic gardens situated near Ardingly, West Sussex in the High Weald, and is Kew's wild botanic garden. Wakehurst is home to the Millennium Seed Bank, the largest wild plant seed bank in the world, and over 500 acres of diverse landscapes and plants from across the globe. It was chosen to complement Kew Gardens as it has a different climate and soil type and so is suitable for growing a different range of plants.

The Wakehurst gardens were largely created by Gerald Loder (later Lord Wakehurst) who purchased the estate in 1903 and spent 33 years developing the gardens. He was succeeded by Sir Henry Price, under whose care the Loder plantings matured. Sir Henry left Wakehurst to the nation in 1963 and the Royal Botanic Gardens took up a lease from the National Trust in 1965.

The garden today covers over 500 acres and is full of diverse plants from around the globe, including walled and water gardens, woodland and wetland conservation areas and an American prairie.

Wakehurst attracts around 450,000 visitors a year, with ambitions to grow this number significantly, and hosts a diverse programme, including specially

curated exhibitions, family-friendly tours and trails, a range of seasonal activities, most notably the popular Christmas Glow Wild lantern festival, and workshops and short courses, such as forest bathing, willow deer making and Christmas wreath making.

The Wakehurst team is in the midst of a transformative journey aimed at establishing itself as a nationally recognised visitor destination and a pioneering scientific centre, as part of delivering Kew's Living Collections Strategy. The core focus lies in UK biodiversity and global conservation, seed research, and ecosystem science; being committed to bridging the gap between scientific research and the wider public, and ensuring that Wakehurst's impact resonates locally, nationally, and globally. Wakehurst is also in the midst of a Masterplan project, part of which is the refurbishment and repair of the Wakehurst Place mansion.

# The role

This is an exciting time to join Wakehurst as it continues to play a crucial role in delivering Kew's wider strategy and in the development of global conservation and sustainability. Alongside this, Wakehurst is in the midst of a transformative journey of increasing its recognition as a national visitor destination and a pioneering scientific centre.

The Director of Wakehurst will guide and oversee innovation, coherence and creative quality in Wakehurst's designed and natural landscapes, whilst strengthening collaboration with key peers across Kew, supporting delivery of Kew's Living Collections Strategy for the Wakehurst site. They will take the lead in progressing Wakehurst's Masterplan, guided and supported by the Director of Gardens and the Board of Trustees' Wakehurst Advisory Committee.

As the senior responsible officer for the whole Wakehurst visitor experience, including publicly accessible areas of the Millennium Seed Bank and all areas of the site used by the public or other visitors, they will lead the continuing development of outstanding onsite events and visitor programmes. They will liaise with and advise Kew Estates and other key internal stakeholders to ensure that works on site buildings and infrastructure are delivered according to local priorities, as allowed by budgets.

The Director of Wakehurst sits on Kew's Executive Board and reports to the Director of Gardens. They are responsible for 4 direct reports – Heads of Horticulture & Landscape, Public Programmes, Marketing & Strategic Communications, and Visitor Experience & Commercial – and an overall staff team of c.150 plus c.100 seasonal volunteers, students and apprentices.

# Key responsibilities

#### Strategic Leadership and Management

- Provide inspirational leadership to Wakehurst's Senior Leadership Team and all staff, responsible for the overall direction and management of the site with overall responsibility for day-to-day decisions (excluding the operations of Kew Science), promoting cross organisational collaborative working and an engaged workforce;
- Promote and empower an energetic, flexible team culture of engagement, collaboration, innovation, productivity, and personal development;
- Lead the continuing transformation of Wakehurst to a nationally recognised visitor destination and pioneering scientific centre dedicated to UK biodiversity and global conservation, seed research and ecosystem science;
- Develop and execute a visionary plan to align Wakehurst with this new scope, ensuring its significance and impact with a clear long-term vision combined with a focus on excellence and smart delivery;



- Provide clear vision and leadership for progressing the overall Wakehurst
  Masterplan, including curation of the historic estate alongside close collaboration
  with Kew Estates & Capital Development Department, and lead capital
  development projects as required;
- Manage and guide the formulation of Wakehurst budgets.
- Oversee the administration of funds to support strong financial performance and the application of organisation policies and priorities;
- Represent Wakehurst on Kew's Executive Board, providing insights and strategic advice, and contribute to the discussion and resolution of organisation-wide issues and priorities;
- Support and contribute to the activities and decisions of the Wakehurst Advisory Committee.

#### Science, Horticulture & Landscape

- Continue the development of exceptional standards of conservation, horticulture, landscape design and management with an ecological focus;
- Ensure the delivery of Kew's Living Collections Strategy to ensure high priority conservation outcomes, transform Wakehurst's horticultural status, drive visitation, and membership growth;
- Promote Wakehurst's profile as a national exemplar for conservation and habitat management;
- Provide leadership towards achieving the aims of the Kew Sustainability Strategy;
- Lead the development and delivery of botanic research programs across Wakehurst inspired by natural capital and landscape ecology frameworks;
- Ensure high-impact science outcomes, including public engagement and communication.

#### Partnership Development

- Advocate on behalf of Wakehurst and nurture relationships with external stakeholders, funders, partners, the National Trust, and statutory bodies;
- Collaborate closely with Kew Science and Millennium Seed Bank teams;
- Foster cooperation, knowledge exchange, and joint initiatives both internally and externally.

### <u>Audience Development</u>

- Work with the Senior Management Team on the delivery of events, exhibitions, learning, interpretation, communication, and commercial activities to further Kew's vision and mission;
- Inspire and engage diverse audiences, experts, and stakeholders in the importance of Natural Capital Science and Ecological Horticulture;
- Engage stakeholders at all levels including among external peers, professional networks and the media in the work happening across Wakehurst.



### <u>Commercial Opportunities and Income Generation</u>

- Lead and support the Head of Visitor Experience and Commercial to develop and deliver the business plan ensuring commercial growth of the Wakehurst;
- Collaborate with Kew Enterprises to oversee the development of commercial opportunities at Wakehurst;
- Contribute to self-generated income through support of Kew Consultancy services, Kew Enterprises, charity-based income generation, and activities related to Kew Development.





# Person specification

The ideal candidate will bring all or most of the following attributes:

## Knowledge and experience

- A strong track record of senior leadership in a relevant and similar organisation;
- A track record of overseeing the delivery of strategy and large-scale projects in a relevant context;
- Experience and well-developed understanding of the management of public activities within a cultural attraction or similar place, including educational programmes, visitor events, cultural programmes, and commercial operations;
- Experience of being a member of an executive board, or equivalent senior executive group with organisation-wide responsibilities;
- Significant experience of operational risk management in a public environment;
- Proven professional experience in building, developing, and motivating a large, diverse, complex team;
- Experience in effectively building and managing external partnerships;
- Experience of public-sector political context, ethos, policies, networks and regulations impacting on the running of a public/charitable body and its communication activities.

### Approach and style

- Strong strategic leadership capability with a breadth of perspective across project management, financial planning, and budget management expertise;
- A collegiate and inclusive leadership style and an entrepreneurial and collaborative approach;
- High level of organisational, problem-solving and change skills: able to strategize, plan, prioritise and budget flexibly; create new systems and frameworks; change plans at short notice to adapt to changing priorities; deal with ambiguity, foresee challenging situations and take difficult decisions;
- Excellent communication and presentation skills with an engaging and persuasive style and the ability to represent Kew and Wakehurst with stakeholders at all levels, general and specialist visitors and the media;
- The ability to build strong collaborative relationships with internal and external stakeholders, including networking, negotiating and identifying business opportunities.
- A knowledge and understanding of plant-based science and/or horticulture, including key Wakehurst plant genera and habitats (e.g. grassland and meadows, deciduous woodland, wetlands).
- A knowledge of garden and landscape history.



# Terms of appointment

This role is based at Wakehurst, Ardingly, Haywards Heath, Sussex, RH17 6TN.

### Base salary

The starting salary for this role is £90,000 pa.

#### **Annual leave**

30 days, excluding bank holidays, on entry rising to a maximum of 33 days after 5 years' service.

#### Pension

RBG Kew offer a Group Personal Pension Scheme through Royal London, with an employer contribution of 8% of salary. This is a non-contributory unless you decide to make a voluntary contribution as a % of salary. If you do decide to make a contribution, RBG Kew will match your contribution up to a further 2%, making the total possible employer contribution 10%.
