About Istanbul Modern

Türkiye's first museum of modern and contemporary art, Istanbul Modern mediates the sharing and transfer of the country's artistic heritage on a global scale and brings together artistic productions from various geographies in Istanbul. With a vision to support the diversity of artistic expressions, it collects, preserves, exhibits, researches, and documents works of art. It works to increase access to art through interdisciplinary exhibitions, educational programs and events, and contributes to artists' production and international collaborations.

The museum supports inclusivity and creativity to create a sustainable art ecosystem. It fosters a dialogue with modern and contemporary art for audiences of all ages and walks of life, encouraging people to wonder and think together. The internationally oriented programs strengthen the interaction between artists and audiences by making use of technological developments and enables a multifaceted museum experience.

History

Following the public interest shown in the first International Istanbul Contemporary Art Exhibitions organized by Istanbul Foundation for Culture and Arts in 1987, known today as the Istanbul Biennial, Dr. Nejat F. Eczacıbaşı and Oya Eczacıbaşı embarked on a project to endow Istanbul with a permanent museum of modern and contemporary art.

After a long search, the Feshane, a former 19th century textile manufacturing plant on the Golden Horn, was converted into a space for a museum of contemporary art. Although the building housed the 3rd Istanbul Biennial in 1992, the project never reached its long-term goal. The project, led by Oya Eczacıbaşı after the death of Dr. Nejat F. Eczacıbaşı in 1993, was revived when a customs warehouse on the Galata pier served as the main venue for the 8th Istanbul Biennial in 2003. When President Recep Tayyip Erdoğan, then Prime Minister, gave his approval for the museum to be located in Antrepo No. 4, the museum project was realized.

The 8,000 square meter building was turned over to Istanbul Modern in early 2004 and quickly transformed by Tabanlıoğlu Architects into a modern museum building with all corresponding functions. After spending 14 years in this building as Turkey's first museum of modern and contemporary art, Istanbul Modern moved to a temporary space in the Beyoğlu district of Istanbul in March 2023, where it welcomed visitors for the next three years while the new building was being constructed.

The New Museum

The new museum, designed by Renzo Piano Building Workshop, replaces the original museum building at the same location, an old customs warehouse on the Bosphorus waterfront that was taken over by Istanbul Modern in 2004. The Museum's stunning location on the new waterfront promenade, previously inaccessible to the public, gives visitors the opportunity to gaze across the water towards the Anatolian side, Princes' Islands and the Historical Peninsula from this unique viewpoint. The design of the new building was inspired by the glittering waters and light reflections of the Bosphorus.

A transparent ground floor strengthens the connection between the waterfront and Tophane Park. At ground level, the circular columns and round mechanical funnels form an architectural landscape, the shapes of these structural elements softening the transition between light and shadow and creating a bright and safe environment by removing the sharp division between light and dark.

A café, museum shop, library, information points and educational workshop spaces are located on the ground floor next to the main lobby. The public areas of the museum are connected by a wide central stairway suspended in a large void in the centre of the lobby.

From the ground floor lobby, the stairs provide access to a 156-seat auditorium on an underground mezzanine. Photography and pop-up galleries are located on the first floor, as are staff offices, education and event rooms. The restaurant on the south façade has an outdoor terrace with views toward the sea. All lobby spaces on upper levels give visitors a view of both the park and water, maintaining a visual connection to the surroundings. This also helps visitors orientate themselves through the building.

The second-floor houses permanent and temporary exhibition galleries, where also a staircase leads to a glass lantern opening onto a rooftop viewing terrace that hovers above a shallow plane of water spread across the entire roof. A metaphysical connection is created by the reflections of the city on both the water feature and the sea, which merge into one.



Exhibitions

Collection Exhibition

Exhibitions curated from the museum's collection reveal the continuity and interaction between Türkiye's modern and contemporary art. Through thematic and chronological approaches, the exhibitions present the changes and transformations in the history of art, often while bringing together artists from Türkiye and different geographies.

Istanbul Modern's pop-up exhibitions focus on different disciplines in contemporary art and mainly bring together artists from younger generations under different themes.








The Role

The Board of Istanbul Modern are looking to recruit a visionary and dynamic Director, who will be responsible for setting the strategic direction for the Museum as it looks to the future. This is a hugely exciting time to join Istanbul Modern; the new Renzo Piano building opened summer 2023 to great acclaim, and visitor numbers are at a record high. The opportunity is around raising the Museum's profile internationally and ensuring that there is a strong vision and strategy around programming, the collection and wider social influence of the Museum.

Key responsibilities

- In collaboration with the Board and Executive team, design and implement a vision and strategy for the Museum, including a programming, and collection strategy;
- Represent and advocate for the Museum with key stakeholders internationally;
- Maintain and develop existing relationships, establish new relationships, and follow developments across the international art world;
- Be responsible for both Istanbul Modern and Eczacibaşi collections, including safeguarding of artworks;
- Support the Business Development department in revenue generation, including sponsorship and fundraising;
- Support the relevant departments to maximise commercial revenues (shop, cafe, restaurant, events inside and outside the museum, membership, young modern, box office, education sales);
- Work with the Business Director and Finance Director on the museum budget;
- Ensure that permanent collection and temporary exhibition programmes are realised in accordance with the museum's vision and mission;
- Support the cinema department for the content and execution of cinema programs;
- Support the department in the development and management of the museum library;
- Work closely with the Marketing Director and communication teams to increase the
 awareness and reputation of the Istanbul Modern brand, to ensure that all kinds of
 corporate identity activities related to the museum are designed and implemented in
 accordance with the principles;



- Work with the Business Director and Human Resources Manager on personnel management and human resources issues. Create strategies for training, personal development and the expansion of general professional awareness;
- Work with the Chair of the Board and Chief Curator in the effective functioning and development of the International Advisory Board;
- Develop possible partnership projects with international museums, including loans;
- To work with the Corporate Communications Director on the Museum's Corporate Communication activities; and
- To manage crisis communication in all kinds of crisis situations that may occur, to provide the necessary leadership and coordination for the solution of the crisis.
