ACADEMIC

SUCCESS AT ELLESMORE IS ALWAYS MEASURED BY PERSONAL BEST AND NEVER AGAINST ANY PREDEFINED TARGET.

Our philosophy is that everyone learns differently and that every learning style is a special gift. We also know that students develop at different rates and at different times. Individual goals are respected and supported. Our pupils look to a wide range of routes into the adult world; we are blessed with young people who have a dazzling array of talents - all will find out what they are good at and we will nurture that.

We offer a diverse academic programme, including A levels, the International Baccalaureate, BTEC Sports Performance Diploma, and a wide range of GCSE choices.

Exam results

The 2023 GCSE we celebrated an overall pass rate of 80%, which was well above the UK pass rate (of 67%) and 25% of grades were the top 9-7 range (A*/A) - above the UK top range rate of 20%.

At A-level, we celebrated a 98% pass rate with 66% of IB students achieving 30 or more points, the gold standard for the IB Diploma. Leaver destinations included Cambridge, Bath, Durham, Exeter and international universities in Miami and Ohio.



Learning Support

Ellesmere College have proudly been recognised as a Category DU (Dyslexia Unit) by The Council for the Registration of Schools Teaching Dyslexic Pupils (CReSTeD) which means the school has a designated Learning Support Unit or Centre providing specialist tuition on a small group or individual basis, according to need, which includes dyspraxia, dyscalculia and other specific learning difficulties.

CReSTeD praised the exceptional levels of work the Support for Learning Department undertakes to ensure teachers are well-informed about individuals with learning needs and that this information is used effectively to create a network of support, including individually-tailored teaching and a wide variety of academic support available outside of lesson time. They also applauded the way the school is "very dedicated to getting the best out of individuals" and remarked how "parents all commented about the improvements in their children's confidence and happiness"



CO-CURRICULAR

THE CO-CURRICULAR PROGRAMME IS A FUNDAMENTAL PART OF LIFE AT ELLESmere COLLEGE

The school week is designed to give dedicated time to co-curricular experiences. This allows all students the opportunity to explore and follow their interests in areas of strength but also the encouragement and support to get involved and take part in areas they have not done so before.

A Woodard School

Ellesmere College is a member of The Woodard Corporation. This educational charity was founded in the mid nineteenth century and inspired by the vision of Canon Nathaniel Woodard. An exponent of the Oxford Movement and the Catholic revival in the Church of England, the Founder's concern was the transformation of his contemporary society through the provision of an education founded on "sound principle and sound knowledge, firmly grounded in the Christian faith."

The foremost charitable object of a Woodard school is "to promote and extend Education (including spiritual, moral, social, cultural and physical education) in accordance with the doctrines and principles of the Church ... in a manner which develops and sustains a Christian environment centred on the Anglican tradition of the Eucharist and at which a fundamental importance is attached to the teaching of those principles."

This means that a Woodard school seeks to provide a strong and distinctive vision and ethos founded on Christian beliefs and values. A high store is set by love, forgiveness, truthfulness, integrity, courage, generosity, reverence, wisdom, thankfulness, humility, endurance, service, compassion, peace, friendship, justice, hope, inclusivity, and respect to all people.

These values are themselves rooted in a Christian understanding of God's Christ-like and triune nature; the doctrines of Creation, Fall and Redemption; a distinctively Christian anthropology which sees all people as having physical, mental and spiritual worth and potential; a missionary call to sanctification both personal and corporate; and a commitment to give voice to all this through sacramental worship.

EC Muscat school offers internationally recognised academic qualifications that follow the IB programme through all levels of the school. THE ROLE

The College Council aim to appoint a dynamic, inspiring, and passionate leader with strategic acumen to guide Ellesmere College into its next phase. The incoming Head will assume leadership of a vibrant school with a holistic educational philosophy.

We seek a candidate who will collaborate closely with the governors and SMT to address the evolving political, economic, and social landscape, ensuring the school realises its long-term vision and potential.

Strategic Leadership and Management

- Develop and implement a long-term strategic plan for Ellesmere College, working with the SMT to determine priorities and measurable goals.
- Communicate the plan to staff, parents and other stakeholders with passion and confidence.
- Demonstrate a dynamic and clear leadership style that empowers the SMT to deliver the strategic plan.
- Demonstrate sound awareness of financial pressures facing independent schools and have an insight into effective cost management alongside developing alternative income streams.
- Seek to fulfil the College's charitable objects as set out in its Articles of Association.
- Encourage an open and collegiate working culture throughout the College.
- Model the values and ethos of the College through hard work, enthusiasm, respect, and ensure the safeguarding of both pupils and staff.

Governance

- Advise and assist the College Council in carrying out their role, to ensure proper governance and the meeting of charitable objectives.
- Attend termly Council meetings, and committee meetings as required.
- Ensure that the College Council are fully and promptly briefed on matters about which they may need to be aware as charity trustees.
- Advise on and oversee a draft annual budget for presentation to the College Council for consideration and approval.
- Ensure that the College operates within the approved annual budget.
- Ensure that the College's internal policies are adhered to and take professional external advice when appropriate or necessary, plus Safeguarding and Health & Safety etc.

Educational Leadership and Management

- Promote Ellesmere's educational philosophy and Christian ethos.
- Select, appoint, and retain outstanding teachers dedicated to realising students' full potential through High-Performance Learning principles.
- Ensure students feel valued, secure, and ready to learn, fostering opportunities for engagement in diverse activities to develop life skills and community spirit.
- Prioritise a nurturing environment that emphasises learning enjoyment and mental health alongside academic progress.
- Monitor student progress effectively to ensure all reach their full potential and achieve optimal examination outcomes.
- Evaluate teaching and learning standards and implement necessary improvements.
- Provide opportunities for staff professional development and demonstrate effective change management skills.
- Enforce disciplinary measures when required, following relevant policies and procedures.

Ellesmere College International:

- Seek out and maximise opportunities to franchise the Ellesmere College name with overseas schools whilst safeguarding its reputation.
- Work closely with Ellesmere, Muscat to ensure that the terms of agreement are met and enhance the relationship.
- Monitor and support ongoing discussions with overseas schools regarding franchise arrangements participate personally as required.
- Provide direction to the ECI team for developing new opportunities internationally including international travel to show senior commitment.

Promotional Activities:

- To drive and support the school's programme of local, national and international recruitment.
- Encouraging and supporting families in relation to the sustained retention of pupils.
- To meet with international partners and build a shared ethos for education and recruitment.
- Be the public face of Ellesmere College, promoting the values of an Ellesmere Education to all internal and external stakeholders, including partaking in any required media activity.
- Help to promote and secure donations to school funds and bursaries both from alumni and more generally.
- Maintain links with local schools to ensure the number of pupils admitted to the College is in line with the strategic plan.
- Ensure good, clear, and timely communications with the parents of current and prospective pupils.
- Promote good relations, loyalty and regular contact between the College and its alumni.
- Attend Old Ellesmerian events in the UK and overseas, continuing to promote the school and its ethos.

The Head will demonstrate exceptional leadership, backed by a track record of academic excellence and effective communication abilities to instil confidence in the College Council and wider staff body. He or she will inspire staff to deliver the comprehensive and holistic educational experience Ellesmere is known for.

Qualifications and Experience

- Strong academic qualifications (a good honours degree and a post graduate qualification in educational leadership) and alignment with the Christian ethos.
- A proven track record of leading a complex, multi-phase school and successful management of the school's finances.
- An understanding of current educational policy and how the College can position itself within that landscape.
- Experience of teaching in a coeducational setting, and ideally in a boarding school environment.
- Evidence of continuing and relevant professional development.

Leadership and Management

- Demonstrate an effective leadership style that focuses on continuous improvement, building positive, nurturing relationships and collaborative working.
- Be able to manage staff, pupils and parents sensitively through periods of change.


