We manage the city's award winning museums - The Burrell Collection, Riverside Museum, Kelvingrove Museum and Art Gallery, St Mungo's Museum of Religious Life and Art, Gallery of Modern Art, People's Palace, Provand's Lordship and the Glasgow Museums Resource Centre, and we also care for the city's world class collection. Alongside our museums, we manage an extensive portfolio of iconic and diverse venues across the city including the Emirates Arena, the Mitchell Library, Tramway and the Glasgow Royal Concert Hall.





Glasgow Life Museums

Glasgow Life Museums are award-winning and world-class assets of national and international significance, and they play a crucial role in bringing tourism to Glasgow and Scotland. Home to more than five million items, Glasgow's outstanding civic art and heritage collection has been described as one of the finest in Europe.

Managed by a team whose passion and care for the city's collection has driven record visitor numbers and whose expertise as innovators in museums practice is recognised globally, Glasgow Life Museums welcomed nearly four million visitors in 2023/24 with more than half of all visits (55%) coming from outside the UK.

Glasgow Life Museums are the most visited civic museums in the UK and one in every three visits to a local authority museum in Scotland today is in Glasgow. Offering free access, a comprehensive learning programme and regularly hosting highprofile events and exhibitions, our museums bring audiences to Scotland because of their exceptional quality, breadth and diversity.

At the same time, Glasgow Life Museums are committed to inclusivity and accessibility, with 50% of local visitors living in parts of the city that face some of the highest levels of deprivation in Scotland (Scottish Index of Multiple Deprivation, SIMD 1 and 2).

Three Glasgow Life Museums – Kelvingrove Art Gallery and Museum, Riverside Museum and the Gallery of Modern Art (GoMA) – currently feature in the Association of Scottish Visitor Attractions' (ASVA) latest list of Scotland's top 10 most visited free attractions.

This reflects consistently high satisfaction rates across our museums with our most recent visitor survey showing 99% of visitors rated their visit positively; 95% said they would recommend Glasgow Life Museums; and 82% said following their visit they felt a greater connection to the city.

Glasgow Life Museums

Our Museums

The Burrell Collection: Having welcomed 1.3m visitors since reopening in March 2022 following a five-year £68.25m refurbishment, The Burrell Collection is one of the most accessible fine and decorative art museums in the world. In 2023, it was named recipient of the world's most prestigious museums' prize, The Art Fund Museum of the Year, and is currently hosting a major retrospective exhibition of the life and works of Degas.

Kelvingrove Art Gallery and Museum: With 22 galleries showcasing Ancient Egypt to the Glasgow Boys, and the works of Charles Rennie Mackintosh to Dali's iconic Christ of St John of the Cross, there's something for everyone and every age. Our latest exhibition, 'Glasgow – City of Empire' explores the impacts of transatlantic slavery and colonialism on the city.

Riverside Museum: Designed by renowned architect, Dame Zaha Hadid, Riverside is Glasgow's transport and technology museum, and a winner of the European Museum of the Year award. It offers a unique opportunity to learn about Glasgow's industrial heritage, the people who shaped the city, and the transport innovations that have shaped the world.

Gallery of Modern Art (GoMA): Home to Glasgow's contemporary art collection, GoMA features an incredible mix of paintings, sculptures, installations, videos and digital art, including works by Turner Prize winners and emerging artists. In 2023, the museum hosted Banksy's first exhibition anywhere in the world in more than a decade. The blockbuster show attracted over 180,000 visitors across its 10-week run and boosted the city's economy by more than £13m.

The People's Palace and Winter Gardens: The People's Palace and Winter Gardens is Glasgow's social history museum, exploring life in the city over the last two centuries. With funding from various partners and donors, including Glasgow City Council and the National Lottery Heritage Fund (NLHF), an exciting and ambitious £35.9m refurbishment of the building is currently underway which will reimaging this invaluable cultural and heritage asset and create a more accessible and sustainable museum and glasshouse for generations to come.

St Mungo Museum of Religious Life and Art:
Named after Glasgow's patron saint who brought
the Christian faith to the city in the 6th century, the
museum sits at the heart of Glasgow's medieval
Cathedral precinct and houses a stunning collection
of objects and artworks exploring the importance of

of objects and artworks exploring the importance of religion in peoples' lives across the world and through time.

Provand's Lordship: Located opposite the St Mungo

Museum of Religious Life and Art, Provand's Lordship is the oldest house in Glasgow. Having been built in 1471, it is one of only four surviving medieval buildings in the city and tells the story of what life was like in the city more than 500 years ago. The museum reopened to the public in March 2024 following a significant £1.6m investment programme to restore the building's exterior to its authentic 15th century appearance.

Glasgow Museums Resource Centre (GMRC):

GMRC is a purpose-built museum storage facility and visitor centre. It's a treasure trove of thousands of objects and paintings from the city's collection when they are not on display in our museums, which can be accessed by the public through free, bookable tours.

The Role

Overseeing one of the finest collections in Europe, Glasgow Life Museums care for the city's collection of over five million items. From objects made by ancient civilisations to medieval tapestries to art by the French Impressionists and steam locomotives, the collection is vast and offers fascinating insights into the lives of people around the world and through the centuries.

Glasgow Life's vision is to inspire every citizen and visitor to become engaged and active in a city globally renowned for culture and sport. As a charity, we find innovative ways to make this happen across Glasgow's diverse communities. Our cultural and sporting programmes, experiences and events promote inclusion, happiness and health while also supporting the city's visitor economy, enhancing the city's mental, physical and economic wellbeing.

The Head of Museums & Collections is an exciting senior management role in Glasgow Life. They are responsible for the development and oversight of the delivery of all museum's services, maximising their impact and leading the team to deliver inclusive services through challenge, innovation and effective business planning.

They oversee the care and display of the museum's collection and lead the curatorial, exhibition, conservation, education, and programming functions in support of Glasgow Life's strategic priorities and business plan. They have responsibility for visitor experiences, supporting the delivery of key plans and strategies for the city of Glasgow including the Glasgow Tourism Strategy, and the role of museums in Glasgow's Culture Strategy.

Key Responsibilities

- You will lead, advise and support Glasgow Life on all matters relating to the collection managed on behalf of Glasgow City Council;
- You will maximise opportunities with city, national and international partners to develop exhibitions, programmes and initiatives, ensuring that Glasgow Life's Museums has a pipeline of world class programming including research, exhibitions, displays and other means of public engagement with the collection;

- You will lead, deliver and oversee planned strategic and capital projects and programmes of change, ensuring effective financial controls, which contribute to the delivery of agreed outcomes and improve the mental and physical wellbeing of citizens and visitors;
- You will represent both the collection and Glasgow Life externally, including in the media and engage with a wide range of stakeholders both in the UK and internationally;
- You will manage commercial strategies across Glasgow Life Museums, ensuring opportunity for income generation is maximised and in line with Glasgow Life's priorities;
- In line with Glasgow Life's Behavioural Framework, you will provide leadership at a time of change and transformation, overseeing a positive culture and change within the Museums team;
- You will lead by example, support collaborative cross service working; and
- You will lead a multi-disciplinary team and demonstrate Glasgow Life's core leadership competencies and behaviours across all Glasgow Life services, working with drive, passion, and energy to promote the vision and values of Glasgow Life.
